

Subject: Crescent Avenue Sidewalk Project

Date: April 27, 2021

During recent meetings discussing the sidewalk project, the Board has discussed having the project start this summer. While the initial timeline did project a summer start date as possible, the rounds of revisions and public involvement have significantly put the City behind that original schedule.

Below is an updated schedule for the Crescent Avenue Sidewalk Project from BFA. This assumes that the board requests no additional revisions at the April 28th work session. BFA also noted that in the last year, most of their clients have significantly increased their work load, and therefore scheduling projects is becoming critical. In some cases, the duration listed below anticipates that work on a particular item might not begin for several weeks due to scheduling.

The project could possibly be finished sooner, with the biggest factors being how quickly the City is able to complete the right-of-way acquisition and how quickly BFA is able to get the work scheduled.

- 1. BFA to gather field data and prepare a topographic survey of the project area. **Grading plan, topographic survey, site plan and cost estimate delivered Jan. 8, 2021.**
 - a. These plans were discussed at a Jan. 15 work session. BFA was directed to prepare revised plans.
- 2. BFA to prepare Concept Plan for City Approval. City to provide feedback and comments. **Currently at this stage.**
 - a. Three variations of the plan (concepts A, B and C) were delivered on Feb. 12 and discussed by the board at a Feb. 17 work session. The board directed BFA to prepare versions of Concept Plan A and Concept Plan C that could be presented to residents.
 - b. Versions of Concept Plan A and Concept Plan C without labels were delivered on Feb. 23
 - c. Meetings held with homeowners on March 1 and March 2. The Board discussed the feedback from these meetings on March 3 and directed BFA to make several revisions to the concept plan.
 - d. Concept Plan D was delivered on April 2. The Board reviewed the plan during a work session on April 7.
 - e. Open House on the Concept Plan was held on April 19.
- 3. BFA to prepare Preliminary Design and Layout: Duration 6 to 12 weeks Estimated Delivery Date: June 9 to July 21
 - a. Start utility coordination
 - b. Prepare Preliminary Design for City review and comment
 - c. Prepare an updated cost estimate



- 4. City Easement/Right-of-way Acquisition: Duration 8 to 16 weeks Estimated Delivery Date: Sept. 15 to Nov. 10
 - a. City to determine the type of documents needed for acquisition.
 - b. Depending on the type of document needed this may or may not need BFA's services.
 - c. City to determine the estimated duration of their review. BFA recommends 4 to 6 weeks.
- 6. BFA to prepare Final Design and Prepare Bid Documents: 6 to 8 weeks Estimated Delivery Date: Dec. 22 to Jan. 5, 2022
 - a. Prepare a final set of plans
- Bidding Period: Duration 4 to 6 weeks
 Estimated End of Bidding Period: Feb. 2 to Feb. 16
- 8. Construction begins 2 to 4 weeks later
 Construction Start Date: March 2 to March 16
- 8. Construction: Duration 60 to 90 Days

 Construction End Date: May or June 2022



Crescent Avenue Sidewalk Project






Are you a resident of Twin Oaks?




How would you rate your level of support for this specific project?

The sidewalk needs to go beyond golden oaks-are there plans for this? It's so dangerous for those walking or riding bikes etc. it's tight already with everyday traffic.

When can it get started?

Sidewalks on all our streets would be a great improvement. Anyone who walks on our street is always looking over their shoulder.

I'd like to see plans going forward that makes this a city wide project.

Would love to see more sidewalks in our community.

The city does not have a full long term plan citywide sidewalks, this plan should be part of an overall plan. a full plan should be vetted out first before any work is started. This will greatly impact and disrupt my property. The project will disrupt my ability to work as I work from home. This project will not eliminate any safety concerns as it only covers 1 block. The city has not provided any data points regarding safety on this street, like the number of accidents, number of pedestrian involved accidents. The city failed to properly survey pedestrians to gain data points of where is person walking to: Store, Fritz. or park to determine if 1 block of sidewalk is sufficient. This entire project is being forced on the residents because of a feeling (no data point) that it is unsafe. I feel that it is irresponsible to make decisions based on feelings and not facts backed up by data, surveys etc.

As a property owner I feel I have no voice or chose as to what the city is going to do to my property

I feel this project is very poorly thought out. The sidewalk will not benefit any Twin Oaks residents. The cost to continue the project further down Crescent Ave. will be astronomical considering the grade of the land. there was talk of hopefully getting Valley Park to get involved or have Mr. Young donate property, that will not ever happen. Especially the way the city treated him while he was filling his property. There are no plans or funding for phase two. Honestly my feeling is that this is a personal agenda being carried out. We have seen it before when Mary Young got her driveway replaced..

Exciting to see a more walkable infrastructure for a very community oriented neighborhood.

Walk there all the time a side walk is very much needed

I would love to see more sidewalks in our community, especially on Boly Lane and Autumn Leaf Drive to Twin Oaks Park!

Project services only two homes in Twin Oaks. Not worth the investment.

Pedestrian safety needs to be a high priority.

How much intrusion into homeowners property? Avoid that as much as possible.

I am against taking any portion of a persons property, for public use without their permission. This is being presented as a safety issue. I do not feel all option have been explored with regards to safety alternatives to an extremely expensive concrete project. The full scope of this endeavor to create a "walkable" community is outrageously expensive. I am not sure why the last question on this survey is being asked.

A better and COMPLETE PLAN is needed BEFORE anything is started. Crescent Ave is not a safe street to walk on. But before my front yard, and fully mature Willow Oak Tree have to be sacrificed for this, and all the costly utility moves are incurred, it makes no sense to put a sidewalk on the proposed side of Crescent rather than on the Valley Park side which is currently an open field. And don't tell me that that property owner will not 'go along with it'.

Anyone who feels that Crescent Ave. is not safe for walking or jogging should avoid using it for that. And I do hope you will fix the communication problem caused when not all Twin Oaks residents receive information like this survey. I am also interested in reading the minutes that someone surely took from the open house on Mon., Apr. 19, 2021.

I just wish this would go all the way to the 141 overpass.

None specific to this project, but would also like to have the city look into sidewalks along old 141.

Crescent Ave needs a sidewalk from the park all the way to the valley park border
